Ed Sheeran scores fourth #1 album.

Three Australian albums debut in the Top 10.

Lil Nas X tops Australian Singles Chart for thirteenth week.

Singles Highlights

#1: Lil Nas X 'Old Town Road' – Lil Nas X's 'Old Town Road' holds #1 on the ARIA Singles Chart for a thirteenth week. This week, a new remix of the track was released featuring rapper **Young Thug** and 12-year-old **Mason Ramsey** (aka viral sensation 'Walmart Yodelling Kid'). This now puts the American rapper level with two other 13-week chart toppers - **Luis Fonsi & Daddy Yankee's** 'Despacito' (13 weeks, 2017) and **Coolio's** 'Gangsta's Paradise' (13 weeks, 1995/95). Only one song has spent more weeks at the top in Australia - **Ed Sheeran's** 'Shape Of You' (2017) with 15 weeks.

#3: Billie Eilish 'Bad Guy' – **Billie Eilish's** former #1 'Bad Guy' jumps back up the chart from #6 to #3 this week. It comes on the back of the release of a new remix of the song featuring **Justin Bieber**. 'Bad Guy' spent two weeks at #1 in April and hasn't dropped out of the Top Ten since.

#4: Ed Sheeran Feat. Khalid 'Beautiful People' – With his *No.6 Collaborations Project* debuting at #1 on this week's Albums Chart, **Ed Sheeran** has inevitably scored multiple entries in the Singles Chart. Having taken out 17 places in the Top 50 the week his previous album ÷ was released, the English singer-songwriter has managed to claim 11 entries this time around. Of those 11, three are in the top ten – 'Beautiful People' (#4), 'I Don't Care' (#5) and 'Cross Me' (#7) – and six are debuts: 'Antisocial' (#11), 'South Of The Border' (#14), 'Remember The Name' (#15), 'Take Me Back To London' (#29), 'Put It All On Me' (#48) and 'Way To Break My Heart' (#50).

#8: Tones And I ‘Dance Monkey’ – Byron Bay-based artist **Tones And I** continues her climb up the Singles Chart. After cracking the Top Ten for the first time last week, the singer-songwriter’s ‘Dance Monkey’ is up a further two spots to a new peak of #8, making her the highest charting Australian on the Singles Chart for the week.

#9: Guy Sebastian ‘Choir’ – **Guy Sebastian**’s first top ten entry in six years, ‘Choir’, holds its place in the Top Ten for a third straight week, taking out the #9 spot this week.

Albums Highlights

#1: Ed Sheeran ‘No.6 Collaborations Project’ – British singer-songwriter **Ed Sheeran** takes out his fourth #1 on the ARIA Albums Chart as he debuts in the top spot with fourth studio album, *No.6 Collaborations Project*. The follow-up to ÷ (#1 Mar. ’17) features a host of guest appearances including **Justin Bieber, Camila Cabello, Eminem, 50 Cent, Cardi B, Stormzy, Chance The Rapper, Bruno Mars, Khalid** and more. Sheeran has also had #1s on the ARIA Albums Chart with albums + (#1 Aug. ’12) and x (#1 Jun. ’14).

#2: Dope Lemon ‘Smooth Big Cat’ – **Angus Stone** returns to his **Dope Lemon** moniker for *Smooth Big Cat*. Coming three years on from *Honey Bones* (#11 Jun. ’16), the second album from the Sydney act is the first to hit the Top Ten. *Smooth Big Cat* tops this week’s ARIA Vinyl Albums Chart, beating out Ed Sheeran. Between albums, Stone and sister Julia released the album *Snow* (#2 Sept. ’17).

#4: Thelma Plum ‘Better In Blak’ – Brisbane-born, Melbourne-based singer-songwriter **Thelma Plum** makes her ARIA Charts debut with *Better In Blak*. Prior to the release of her debut album, Plum had released two EPs: *Rosie* (2013) and *Monsters* (2014). *Better In Blak* features contributions by **Paul Kelly, Dave Le’aupepe (Gang of Youths)** and **Alex Burnett (Sparkadia)**. Most notably, ex-Beatle **Sir Paul McCartney** contributed guitar to the track ‘Made For You’.

#7: Allday ‘Starry Night Over The Phone’ – **Allday** scores for a third Top Ten entry on the ARIA Albums Chart with *Starry Night Over The Phone*. The Adelaide rapper’s third album includes collaborations with The Veronicas and Japanese Wallpaper, among others. He previously charted with *Startup Cult* (#3 Jul. ’14) and *Speeding* (#6 May ’17).

#10: Soundtrack ‘The Lion King’ – The soundtrack to the remake of *The Lion King* makes its Albums Chart debut in the same week the film hits cinemas around Australia. The album includes new versions of favourites from the original film including ‘Can You Feel The Love Tonight’ and ‘Hakuna Matata’, as well as a new

Beyoncé track – ‘Spirit’ – and ‘Never Too Late’, a new track by **Elton John** (who composed the original film’s songs along with **Tim Rice**). The soundtrack to the original version of *The Lion King* peaked at #3 in October 1994 and was accredited 4x Platinum.
