Justin Bieber scores second number one single, as Adele's '25' holds for a third week ... on this week's ARIA Charts

Singles Chartifacts:

#1: Justin Bieber 'Love Yourself' – Justin Bieber picks up his second #1 on the ARIA Singles Chart with 'Love Yourself'. The track has hit #1 in its fourth week in the top 50. Bieber first hit #1 on the Singles Chart back in September when 'What Do You Mean?' spent four weeks in the top spot.

#7: DJ Snake Feat. Bipolar Sunshine 'Middle' – A move of 12 spots puts 'Middle' into the top ten for the first time. It's the single's sixth week in the top 50.

#9: Hilltop Hoods Feat. James Chatburn 'Higher' (debut) – The week's highest debut comes from the Hilltop Hoods. 'Higher' comes from the Adelaide trio's forthcoming 'Walking Under Stars/Drinking From The Sun: Restrung' album which sees them team up with the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra and Adelaide Chamber Singers Choir to rerecord, remix and restructure tracks from 'Drinking From The Sun' (#1 Mar. '12) and 'Walking Under Stars' (#1 Aug. '14).

#11: Sigala 'Sweet Lovin' (debut) – The second ARIA Singles Chart appearance for British tropical-house DJ/producer Sigala. In its first week in the top 50, 'Sweet Lovin' has overtaken 'Easy Love' (#14 Sept. '15) as Sigala's highest peak.

#20: Coldplay 'Adventure Of A Lifetime' – With 'A Head Full Of Dreams' debuting at #2 on this week's Albums Chart, its lead single has jumped 16 spots to pick up a new peak. Its Coldplay's eleventh top 20 single in Australia.

Albums Chartifacts:

#1: Adele '25' – Adele may have lost the #1 spot on the Singles Chart but '25' has notched up its third week at the top of the ARIA Albums Chart. '21' and '19' are at #15 and #26 respectively.

#2: Coldplay 'A Head Full Of Dreams' (debut) – Coldplay return with seventh studio album, 'A Head Full Of Dreams', the follow-up to 'Ghost Stories' (#1 May '14).

#6: Troye Sivan 'Blue Neighbourhood' (debut) – After topping the Albums Chart in September with 'Wild' (#1 Sept. '15), Troye Sivan returns with 'Blue Neighbourhood'. The release features the singles 'Wild' (#16 Sept. '15), 'Talk Me Down' (#36 Oct. '15) and 'Youth' (#44 Nov. '15).

#14: Cyrus 'Cyrus' (debut) – The debut album from 2015 X Factor winner Cyrus Villanueva. It features single 'Stone' (#4 Nov. '15), as well as tracks performed during his run on the show including his version of Chris Isaak's 'Wicked Game' (#6 Oct. '15).

#36: G-Eazy 'When It's Dark Out' (debut) – G-Eazy picks up his first ARIA Charts appearance as lead artist with the album 'When It's Dark Out'. It's the American rapper's second studio album and features a number of collaborators including Big Sean, Chris Brown and Grace, who previously worked with G-Eazy on the single 'You Don't Own Me' (#1 May '15).
