**New number ones on this week's ARIA Charts:
Redfoo blasts to the peak of the singles chart and Arctic Monkeys
take over album chart**

Singles:

Top 5:

1. Redfoo 'Let's Get Ridiculous' (debut)

Singles Chartifacts:

#1: Redfoo 'Let's Get Ridiculous' (debut) - First solo #1 for X Factor judge and LMFAO member Redfoo. It is the second single to chart from his forthcoming solo album I Look Good Naked, following I'll Award You With My Body (#58 Jun. 13). LMFAO have hit #1 on the ARIA Singles Chart twice; first spending ten weeks there with Party Rock Anthem (#1 Apr. 11) and nine weeks with Sexy And I Know It (#1 Oct. 11).

#3: Miley Cyrus 'Wrecking Ball' - A jump of 12 spots from last week's debut position moves it one spot above the peak of previous single We Can't Stop (#4 Jul.13).

#7: OneRepublic 'Something I Need' - Up nine spots from last week. Becomes the band's third top ten, including their Timbaland collaboration Apologize (#1 Nov. 07).

#14: Drake Feat. Majid Jordan 'Hold On, We're Going Home' - Experienced a jump of 16 spots in its third week in the top 50. It becomes the Canadian rapper's second top 20 single but still has a way to go to outdo Take Care (#9 Feb. 12).

#29: Martin Garrix 'Animals' (debut) - Chart debut for 17 year old Dutch DJ Martin Garrix. Animals has experienced considerable chart success across Europe.

#30: Coldplay 'Atlas' (debut) - The first Coldplay entry into the top 50 in over a year is the band's contribution to the forthcoming The Hunger Games: Catching Fire soundtrack. They last charted with their collaboration with Rihanna, Princess Of China (#16 Jul. 12).

Albums Chartifacts:

#1: Arctic Monkeys 'AM' (debut) - The fifth studio album from the Sheffield quartet and their second to top the ARIA Chart. All five albums have charted in the ARIA top five. Their other chart-topper was with debut album Whatever People Say I Am, That's What I'm Not (#1 Feb.06).

#2: London Grammar 'If You Wait' (debut) - Debut album from much-hyped London indie pop trio. They made their first ARIA Charts appearance in May with the Metal & Dust EP (#68 May 13). They also made an appearance on one track from Disclosure's debut album Settle (#5 Jun. 13).

#5: Tonight Alive 'The Other Side' (debut) - Sydney pop-punk quintet's second album. The follow-up to What Are You So Scared Of? (#15 Oct. 11) becomes their highest chart peak to date.

#6: Violent Soho 'Hungry Ghost' (debut) - The third studio album from Brisbane rock quartet Violent Soho and their first to appear on the ARIA Charts. Hungry Ghost comes more than three years after their self-titled second album.

#15: Goldfrapp 'Tales Of Us' (debut) - British electronic act's sixth album. They were last seen on the chart with Head First (#14 Mar. 10). Their previous best was with Seventh Tree (#11 Mar. 08).

#16: Rise Against 'Long Forgotten Songs: B-Sides & Covers 2000-2013' (debut) - This release compiles odds and ends from over a decade of Rise Against's history. It includes covers of Bob Dylan, Nirvana, Journey and Bruce Springsteen. The band's most recent studio album, Endgame (#2 Mar.11) is also their highest peak to date.

#22: John Legend 'Love In The Future' (debut) - Neo-soul singer-songwriter John Legend's first solo album since Evolver (#66 Nov. 08). He was last seen with the album Wake Up! (#42 Oct. 10), a collaboration with The Roots. Features work with, amongst others, Kanye West and Pharrell Williams.
