



Luis Fonsi & Daddy Yankee achieve nine consecutive weeks at Number One and Ed Sheeran hits sixteen weeks at the top, on this week's ARIA Charts

Singles Chartifacts:

#1: Luis Fonsi & Daddy Yankee Feat. Justin Bieber 'Despacito' – It's the ninth consecutive week Luis Fonsi and Daddy Yankee have held #1 on the ARIA Singles Chart with the Justin Bieber-featured single 'Despacito'.

#5: Calvin Harris Feat. Pharrell Williams, Katy Perry & Big Sean 'Feels' – A jump of four spots for 'Feels' in its fourth week in the top 50 gives Calvin Harris a sixth top five on the Singles Chart. He first hit the top five with 'Sweet Nothing' (#2 Oct. '12) and was most recently there with 'This Is What You Came For' (#1 Jun. '15).

#16: Maggie Lindemann 'Pretty Girl' – In its seventh week in the top 50, 'Pretty Girl' moves up seven spots to crack the top 20 for the first time. The track has already been a top ten hit in the UK, peaking at #9.

#19: Kesha 'Praying' (debut) – American singer-songwriter Kesha returns to the ARIA Singles Chart top 50 for the first time since 2013 with 'Praying'. The single is the first to be released from her forthcoming third album *Rainbow*. She last charted with 'Crazy Kids' (#32 May '13).

#22: Macklemore Feat. Skylar Grey 'Glorious' – After dropping out of the top 50 for a week, Macklemore's debut solo Singles Chart appearance re-enters this week and picks up a new peak in the process.

Albums Chartifacts:

#1: Ed Sheeran '÷' – Ed Sheeran's ÷ notches up its 16th week at #1 on the ARIA Albums Chart.

#3: Jay-Z '4:44' (debut) – Hip hop mogul Jay-Z scores his fourth top ten on the ARIA Albums Chart as a solo artist with his fourteenth studio album, *4:44*. The rapper's first album in four years is the follow-up to *Magna Carta Holy Grail* (#2 Jul. '13) and features guest appearances by his wife, Beyoncé, as well as Frank Ocean and Damian Marley.

#4: Haim 'Something To Tell You' (debut) – Californian sisters Haim return with *Something To Tell You*. It's the trio's second studio album, coming four years on from *Days Are Gone* (#2 Oct. '13). In the studio, Haim worked with a number of artists including former Vampire Weekend member Rostam Batmanglij and Blood Orange's Dev Hynes.

#6: Hillsong United 'Wonder' – After returning to the top ten last week at #9, 'Wonder' jumps up a further three spots on this week's chart following the religious organisation's annual conference.

#11: The Jungle Giants 'Quiet Ferocity' (debut) – With their third studio album, Brisbane four-piece The Jungle Giants achieve a new peak on the ARIA Albums Chart with *Quiet Ferocity*. The band's third album is the follow-up to *Speakerzoid* (#25 Aug. '15). They previously peaked at #12 with debut album *Learn To Exist* (#12 Sept. '13).
