



**On this week's ARIA Charts:
Ed Sheeran takes over with the top 3 singles and reaches seven weeks at No. 1, as Busby Marou claim their first chart topping album!**

Singles Chartifacts:

#1: Ed Sheeran 'Shape Of You' – For the seventh consecutive week, Ed Sheeran sits at #1 on the ARIA Singles Chart with 'Shape Of You'. His latest single 'How Would You Feel (Paean)' debuts at #2 and gives him a hat trick on the singles chart, with 'Castle on the Hill' at #3.

#9: Kygo & Selena Gomez 'It Ain't Me' (Debut) – The single, 'It Ain't Me' is by Norwegian DJ Kygo and features Selena Gomez. It gives both artists their highest peak on the ARIA Singles Chart to date.

#32: Maroon 5 Feat. Future 'Cold' (Debut) – 'Cold' is the second single from the band's upcoming sixth studio album scheduled for release later this year. The first single 'Don't Wanna Know' featuring Kendrick Lamar peaked at #6 in November 2016.

#33: Linkin Park & Kiiara 'Heavy' (Debut) – 'Heavy' is the first single released by the American rock band Linked Park for their upcoming seventh studio album 'One More Light'. This is Linkin Park's first Top 50 ARIA Singles Chart appearance since 2014 when 'Final Masquerade' peaked at #43.

#41: Lana Del Rey 'Love' (Debut) – 'Love' is a song by American singer Lana Del Rey. It is the lead single from her upcoming fifth studio album.

Albums Chartifacts:

#1: Busby Marou 'Postcards From The Shell House' (Debut) – With their third studio album, Australian duo Busby Marou have scored their first #1 on the ARIA Albums Chart. 'Postcards From The Shell House' is Bubby Marou's first ARIA Album Chart appearance since Farewell Fitzroy (#5 Oct. '13).

'Postcards From The Shell House' is the third Australian #1 album on the ARIA Charts in 2017.

#3: Ryan Adams 'Prisoner' (Debut) – 'Prisoner' is the sixteenth studio album by American singer-songwriter Ryan Adams. The follow-up to 1989 (#9 Sept. '15), 'Prisoner' is the singer's sixth album to hit the ARIA top 50 and his third top ten.

#15: The Wiggles 'Nursery Rhymes' (Debut) - The Wiggles pick up their highest ever peak on the Albums Chart with 'Nursery Rhymes'. The compilation brings together 30 tracks performed by the current line-up of the group. Their previous peak was with another compilation, 'The Best Of' (#16 June '16). It's the first Wiggles release to chart in 2017.

#26: Middle Kids 'Middle Kids' (Debut) – Sydney's Middle Kids make their first ARIA Album Chart debut with their self-titled EP, featuring current single 'Never Start'. The Sydney band is made up of Hannah Joy, Tim Fitz and Harry Day.

#42: Future 'Future' (Debut) – 'FUTURE' is the eponymous fifth studio album by American rapper Future and the second to debut on the Top 50 ARIA Albums Chart. His first appearance was in February of 2016 when 'EVOL' peaked at #20.
