Justin Bieber continues to dominate the Singles Chart, as Lana Del Rey takes it straight to the top on debut with 'Honeymoon', on this week's ARIA Charts

Singles Chartifacts:

#1: Justin Bieber 'What Do You Mean?' – Week four at the top of the ARIA Singles Chart for Justin Bieber's 'What Do You Mean?'

#10: Omi 'Hula Hoop' – A jump of ten spots for 'Hula Hoop' in its fourth week in the top 50. It becomes Omi's second top ten, following on from 'Cheerleader (Felix Jaehn Remix)' (#1 Jan. '15).

#11: Robin Schulz Feat. Francesco Yates 'Sugar' – With Schulz's second album, also called 'Sugar', released this week (25/9), the title track jumps 20 spots in its second week in the top 50.

#15: Ellie Goulding 'On My Mind' (debut) – After topping the Singles Chart for four straight weeks earlier in the year with 'Love Me Like You Do' (#1 Feb. '15), Ellie Goulding returns with 'On My Mind'. It's the first single to come from her forthcoming third album, 'Delirium', which is set for release in November.

#22: Drake 'Hotline Bling' (debut) – After scraping into the chart at #50 last week, 'Hotline Bling' has jumped 28 spots in its second week on the chart. The track has already cracked the top ten in the US, it's currently at #9.

Albums Chartifacts:

- **#1: Lana Del Rey 'Honeymoon' (debut)** American singer-songwriter Lana Del Rey picks up her third consecutive #1 on the ARIA Albums Chart with 'Honeymoon'. Del Rey has previously topped the Albums Chart with 'Born To Die' (#1 Feb. '12) and 'Ultraviolence' (#1 Jun. '14). 'Honeymoon' features the single 'High By The Beach' (#51 Aug. '15).
- **#2: David Gilmour 'Rattle That Lock' (debut)** Ex-Pink Floyd guitarist David Gilmour returns with his fourth solo album, 'Rattle That Lock'. Gilmour's first album since 'On An Island' (#23 Apr. '06) nine years ago is his highest solo peak on the ARIA Charts. Last year Gilmour charted as a member of Pink Floyd with the band's final studio album 'The Endless River' (#3 Nov. '14).
- #4: Drake & Future 'What A Time To Be Alive' (debut) In spite of a release part-way through the chart week, rappers Drake & Future make a strong debut with their collaborative mixtape 'What A Time To Be Alive'. The release gives Future his first ARIA Charts appearance. Drake last appeared on the Albums Chart with 'If You're Reading This It's Too Late' (#2 Feb. '15).
- **#7: Jess Glynne 'I Cry When I Laugh' (debut)** The debut album from British singer-songwriter Jess Glynne. 'I Cry When I Laugh' features 'Hold My Hand' (#16 Apr. '15), current single 'Don't Be So Hard On Yourself' (#17 Sept. '15) and Glynne's collaboration with Clean Bandit, 'Real Love' (#13 Dec. '14).
- **#9: Ryan Adams '1989' (debut)** Released on Monday (21/9), Ryan Adams' track-by-track cover of Taylor Swift's '1989' has given the American singer-songwriter his highest ever peak on the ARIA Albums Chart. Adams' previous best was when he peaked at #10 in September 2014 with his self-titled fourteenth album. Swift's '1989' currently sits at #5.
